When an individual child knows you love them, it will become easier to guide them towards positive behavior. This is important with all children, but particularly with children with the most challenging behaviors.

### Establishing Teacher-Child Relationships - PreKinders

High-quality teacher-child relationships are associated with greater gains in academic, social-emotional and executive function outcomes (UVA). Close teacher relationships are significantly related to positive school adjustment outcomes, such as school liking, behavioral engagement and vocabulary skills (OSU).
