However, the provisions for cosmetic claims in Article 20 of the CPR and the Common Criteria apply equally to these claims as well. The ISO Standard 16128 provides guidance on the definition of 'natural' and 'organic' (ISO 16128-1), and how to calculate the % of naturalness of ingredients in finished cosmetic products (ISO 16128-2). There is no legal requirement to comply with the ISO guidelines, it is a company decision.
